16 17	WHEREAS, residents of Wisconsin, regardless of age, are equally impacted by policy decisions made by their elected officials; and
18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, young adults are especially affected by decisions on education policy, but do not have the right to elect school board officials who develop and implement that policy; and
23 24	WHEREAS, young adults have valuable insight towards necessary education reforms and deserve an opportunity to participate in the electoral process; and
25 26 27	WHEREAS, lowering the voting age will enable young adults to form a habit of voting that can continue throughout their lives; and
